People must think of us as Christ's servants, the stewards entrusted with the mysteries of God. What is expected of stewards is that each one should be found worthy of his trust. Not that it makes the slightest difference to me whether you, or indeed any human tribunal, find me worthy, or not. I will not even pass judgement on myself.

True, my conscience does not reproach me at all, but that does not prove that I am acquitted: the Lord alone is my judge.

There must be no passing of premature judgement. Leave that until the Lord comes: he will light up all that is hidden in the dark and reveal the secret intentions of men's hearts. Then will be the time for each one to have what ever praise he deserves, from God.
