THE ACT OF REMEMBRANCE

The Laying of the Wreaths.

The Bidding Prayers now follow

Priest: Let us pray: We thank God for all who counted the service of others, greater than the service of self and who gave their lives that we might live We remember especially today, those who fell in both World Wars and those more recent conflicts in the service of their nation.
Lord in your mercy.

People: Hear our prayer.

Priest: Father we remember how your Son, during the time of his ministry on earth, had great compassion for those who suffered. We bring to you all who still suffer as a result of war.

People: Hear our prayer.

Priest: Let us pray for the peace of the world: for statesmen and rulers, that they might have the wisdom to know, and the courage to do, what is right.

People: Hear our prayer

Priest: We pray in our own hearts, for those known to us who suffer in body, mind or spirit: for those who have asked our prayers and for those who have nobody to pray for them.

Priest: We pray for the dead, especially the dead of war, any who have died recently and those whose anniversaries fall about this time: +Rest eternal grant unto them O Lord

The Priest continues with the Eucharistic Prayer.

After the words of Consecration the priest says:

Priest: The mystery of faith.

People: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again

At the conclusion of the prayer:

Through him, and with him, and in him O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

People: AMEN.

Priest: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Priest: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
