Next Sunday (23rd November) is the Feast of Christ the King and the final Sunday of the church's year. Benediction will be given after the live-streamed Mass from the door of Goldthorpe Church, with the particular intention that we may be freed from the plague of coronavirus.

Christmas Lights

Because we do not know what the situation will be for anyone at Christmas we have taken the decision to go ahead and plan as if Christmas were going to be normal as far as church is concerned. We will decorate church as usual and the Christmas trees will go up inside and outside our churches. Masses will either be with congregations or streamed live via our parish website, (as is the case now). People will also be prayed for at the Masses throughout the Octave of Christmas as usual.

Each Sunday there will be an order of service for you to view and to help you join in.

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples:

master's happiness."

forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me
with two talents; here are two more that I
have made." His master said to him,
"Well done, good and faithful servant;
you have shown you can be faithful in
small things, I will trust you with greater;
come and join in your master's
happiness."
'Last came forward the man who had the
one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you
were a hard man, reaping where you
have not sown and gathering where you
have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I
went off and hid your talent in the
ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have
it back." But his master answered him,

“You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.”
