The Introductory Rites

It is our custom to spend time in quiet reflection before each of our services, this enables us to focus our minds on our worship and prepare to receive the Lord Jesus afresh in our lives.

LENT

Lent is the great Season of Grace in the Church's Year during which we prepare physically and spiritually for the great events of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection by fasting, prayer and works of charity. Our Mass takes on a more sombre tone to focus our minds on our own unworthiness of the great things God does for us in His Son, so that we may be a worthy and holy people devoted to Him.

Taking Abram outside, the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can.' 'Such will be your descendants,' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord,' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' Ukraine

Lent is marked by praying, fasting and almsgiving. The most productive way in which we can keep a holy Lent this year is by actively seeking peace in the Ukraine through our prayer and by using the proceeds from our Fasting as Alms to send to the aid agencies who are endeavouring to help with the situation throughout Eastern Europe. Our Lent Collections this year will go the relief of those who suffer as a result of this war. Please use the enclosed box or make a donation directly to church and this will be sent to the Disasters Emergency Committee. All money donated to this fund will be doubled by the UK Government.

Covid Restrictions

The legal requirement for restrictions in churches and public buildings have been lifted. This means that from today we will re-instate the passing of the Peace. If you do not wish to share the Peace please simply sit down, please do not move around. The Holy water Stoups are re-instated. Hand sanitiser is still available. Holy Communion is still in one kind and will still be received standing for the time being.
