A Reading from the First Letter of Saint Paul to Timothy
1 Timothy 6:6-11. 17-19

Religion, of course, does bring large profits, but only to those who are content with what they have. We have brought nothing into the world and we can take nothing out of it; but as long as we have food and clothing, let us be content with that. People who long to be rich are a prey to temptation; they get trapped into all sorts of foolish and dangerous ambitions which eventually plunge them into ruin and destruction. "The love of money is the root of all evils" and there are some who, pursuing it, have wandered away from the faith, and so given their souls to any number of fatal wounds. But, as a man dedicated to

God, you must avoid all that. You must aim to be saintly and religious, filled with faith and love, patient and gentle. Warn those who are rich in this world's goods that they are not to look down on other people; and not to set their hopes on money, which is untrustworthy, but on God who, out of his riches, gives us all that we need for our happiness. Tell them that they are to do good, and be rich in good works, to be generous and willing to share—this is the way they can save up a good capital sum for the future if they want to make sure of the only life that is real.
