trees, until we have put the seal on the

hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all  
the tribes of Israel.

After that I saw a huge number, impossi-  
ble to count, of people from every nation,  
race, tribe and language; they were  
standing in front of the throne and in front  
of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and  
holding palms in their hands. They shout-  
ed aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on

ground with their foreheads, worshipping

The Profession of Faith (Creed)
