A reading from the Acts of the Apostles  
In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: ‘You yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. **The Blessing of the Water**

*Priest:* Dear brothers and sisters, let us humbly beseech  
the Lord our God to bless this water he has created,  
which will be sprinkled upon us as a memorial of  
our Baptism. May he graciously renew us, that we  
may remain faithful to the Spirit whom we have  
received.

*And after a brief pause in silence, he proclaims the following  
prayer, with hands extended:*

Lord our God, in your mercy be present to your  
people's prayers, and, for us who recall the  
wondrous work of our creation and the still greater  
work of our redemption, graciously bless this  
water. For you created water to make the fields

fruitful and to refresh and cleanse our bodies.  
You also made water the instrument of your mercy:  
for through water you freed your people from slavery and  
quenched their thirst in the desert;  
through water the Prophets proclaimed the new covenant  
you were to enter upon with the human race;  
and last of all, through water, which Christ made holy in  
the Jordan, you have renewed our corrupted nature in the  
bath of regeneration.  
Therefore, may this water be for us a memorial of the  
Baptism we have received, and grant that we may share in  
the gladness of our brothers and sisters, who at Easter have  
received their Baptism.  
Through Christ our Lord.

### **The renewal of Baptismal promises.**

*The peoples candles are lit by the servers and all stand and turn to face the font.*

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church.

And so I ask you:

Priest: Do you renounce Satan?

All: **I do.**

Priest: And all his works?

Priest: And all his empty show?

All: **I do.**

### **Profession of Faith:**

Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty creator of heaven and earth? **R/ I do.**
