On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going towards the tomb. Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, and the face cloth, which had been on the head of Jesus, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

 for through water you freed your people from slavery and
 quenched their thirst in the desert;
 through water the Prophets proclaimed the new covenant
 you were to enter upon with the human race;
 and last of all, through water, which Christ made holy in
 the Jordan, you have renewed our corrupted nature in the
 bath of regeneration.
 Therefore, may this water be for us a memorial of the
 Baptism we have received, and grant that we may share in
 the gladness of our brothers and sisters, who at Easter have
 received their Baptism.
 Through Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

The renewal of Baptismal promises.

The peoples candles are lit by the servers and all stand and turn to face the font.

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church.

And so I ask you:
